In God's wise design, music can speak to our hearts deeply and uniquely. Music can also be a way in which we can speak to God in response. Colossians 3:16 tells us, "Let the word of Christ dwell richly among you, in all wisdom and teaching and admonishing one another through psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs, singing to God with gratitude in your hearts." (CSB)

Elisabeth spoke often of her affection for hymns. She grew up singing hymns around the breakfast table with her family, and she loved to share the ways God used that practice throughout her life. For example, she shared that the hymn *How Firm A Foundation* carried her through grief after she found out her husband Jim had been killed. She noted that many hymns of praise spurred her on toward obedience whether she was in a season of sorrow or one of joy. And while Elisabeth was musically gifted, she encouraged all Christians with the words, "Never mind how we sound, for our singing is to the Lord".

Elisabeth knew that our Creator fashioned us to experience meaningful fellowship with Him when we worship through song. When we sing to Him in praise, we are led to respond to Him with gratitude. When we feel weighed down with despair, singing truths about Him orients us to His unchanging character and faithfulness. Singing calls for humility and vulnerability that helps us place our hearts in His gentle and loving hands.

This month, we are delighted to offer you some wonderful resources from Elisabeth about her beloved hymns. It is our prayer these works will inspire you to lift your heart to the Lord in song through psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs.

### Word from the Board

Elisabeth loved and appreciated music. She enjoyed classical hymns of old, and singing around the piano that she played as gracefully as she spoke!

Unfortunately, I never had the opportunity to hear her play, but her friends and family often attest to her incredibly gifted musical abilities.

My special time around Elisabeth's beloved piano was in June 2015—a few hours after her funeral. In the house that evening with me were my husband, Elisabeth's husband Lars, and five of the precious caregivers who, throughout the years, had lovingly tended to Elisabeth's physical needs and spiritual encouragement. Each young woman had her own unique and treasured memories of her time living at 10 Strawberry Cove.

I watched the Atlantic waters through the window, where Elisabeth had set her gaze nearly every day for the last 38 years. The five caregivers had bravely decided to venture down to the ocean rocks. There they swam in solidarity to honor their beloved Elisabeth's life, and her own love for swimming in the ocean. When they came in, there was a flurry of activity near the front oceanside door. They were pink cheeked and smiling as they sat together on the couch with still wet hair and the cups of hot tea I had just made for each of them. As we sat together, we all knew that Elisabeth's piano was beckoning! They gathered around the piano, and Lars, my husband, and I turned our chairs to sing Elisabeth's favorite hymns with them one last time. With joy in our hearts and tears in our eyes, we all felt somehow Elisabeth might be listening to

this tribute song, along with "the great cloud of witnesses" Hebrews 12 points us to. I watched those young women who had so tenderly and selflessly cared for this special woman of God... the ones who played the piano for her, bathed her, dressed and fed her, and tended to her every need in those last years of her life. Their presence was a sweet reminder of Christ's selflessness as He washed the feet of His disciples. I felt as though we were experiencing a bit of heaven as we heard Elisabeth's piano so sweetly playing along with their beautiful voices. The music ended, and I gazed across the ocean at the mauve sunset God had painted over the skyline that evening. A remembrance of Elisabeth and her love of music made it clear it was well with our souls...

You might ask, where is Elisabeth's piano today? Well, it made its way several years ago from the Atlantic coast to the Pacific coast, and it's now enjoying its new place in the old Elliot Oregon homestead. It continues to bring great musical joy for hymn singing to a new generation of Elliots. As we know, just as Elisabeth would have it... all for God's glory.
